As I write this on the first day of spring, today's weather is more like February. I so want it to be spring but that's how March goes. One day cold and snowy and the next day warm and sunny and I begin to hope again for spring. I watch for all the signs. Buds on trees, robins returning in huge numbers, early flowers starting to bloom. It's coming I know it is. And I feel this sense of waiting, waiting for something to happen.

Around this time four years ago everything shut down. We had no idea how long it was going to be. And we have been irreversibly changed by these past four years. In ways we don't even fully understand yet. I just read a survey of clergy who have been serving in congregations since the beginning of the pandemic and it showed that 81% of clergy have symptoms of PTSD. I suspect that's probably true of all of us.

And yet, we learned a lot. We learned that community care is essential. Caring for the most vulnerable is caring for the whole. We learned lots of new technology, lots and lots. And we have learned, and are learning even more, how to do church differently. And as we row together to whatever comes next, may we remember the lessons of the last four years. Community matters. People matter. Hope matters. And I feel this sense of waiting, waiting for something to happen. Shalom, Salaam, Peace.

MEANINGFUL MOVIES AT UUCRV


Meaningful Movies are on the second Tuesday (1:30 p.m.) and Saturday (6:30 p.m.) of each month through June.

WELCOME FARMER ANNIE SINGER

Once again, there is in the former Food Pantry Garden thanks to Annie Singer and Susan Busker. Last fall Susan noticed Annie's post on the Roscoe/Rockton Neighbors Helping Neighbors Facebook group. Annie was looking for a sunny spot to garden with a nearby water source. Susan thought this was a great opportunity to put UUCRV's fallow garden spot to use and contacted Annie.

In October, Susan and Donna Beaumont met with Annie and all three agreed that it looked like a match. An agreement between Annie and the Board was struck. Annie agreed that in exchange for use of the garden spot and water, Annie will contribute a portion of their crop to a local food bank or other charitable cause. They will also continue the practice of no chemical fertilizers, herbicides, or pesticides.

Annie is relatively new to the area, moving here with their husband Blake and coonhound Darwin in late 2022. BUT Annie is no stranger to gardening and charitable giving. Before moving to Roscoe, they spent two summers working with Beaver Creek CSA (Community Supported Agriculture) in Kenosha. Annie describes themself as "passionate about food justice and food access," and "interested in travel and foods and plants used in different countries and cuisines." They plan to contribute a portion of their crop to Caritas and give some away directly to local families.

It will be a joy to see the garden productive again, and a new friend as well.





Dandelions by Frances Watkins Harper


Welcome children of the Spring,
