
MEANINGFUL MOVIES AT UUCRV

Your charitable donation of \$175.00 dated January 2, 2024 is appreciated.

Thank you for having such confidence in the mission of Caritas and the manner in which that mission is met.

Caritas accomplished much in 2023.

We served 1,976 unduplicated households (1,548 served in 2022, a 27.6% increase) meeting the needs of 4,843 people (3,936 served in 2022, a 23% increase). This is a bittersweet record for Caritas. It is good that we have the ability to meet needs. Sad that so many are in need.

We needed to create new food donation relationships due to a significant decline in food donations from traditional sources. We have been successful in developing those new sources.

Challenges do come with answers. Your support allows us to continue to serve our community.
